Victim: Wanda Jean Lopez, H/F, 24 YOA

Suspect: Carlos DeLuna, H/M, 20 YOA

Witness George Aguirre went to the Sigmor Service Station to put gas in his van while he is putting gas in his van, the alleged suspect Carlos DeLuna approaches Mr. Aguirre and asked him for a ride to the Club Casino, at 1001 S. Port. DeLuna offers Mr. Aguirre, "money, beer or dope" in return for the ride. Mr. Aguirre refused to give the suspect a ride. During the conversation with the suspect, Mr. Aguirre observed the suspect to pull out a lockblade knife and open it. He further observed the suspect to place the knife in his pocket. Afterwards, Mr. Aguirre observed the suspect to return back to the front of the service station near the ice machine. Mr. Aguirre finished gasing up, he then went into the service station and as he was paying for his gas he told the victim, Wanda Lopez that there was a man outside with a knife and that he was going to call the police. Ms. Lopez told Mr. Aguirre that she would also be calling the police.

The victim, Wanda Lopez then called the Police Emergency number and spoke to Jesus Escochea, dispatcher. Ms. Lopez requested that a police unit be sent to her location and she further advised Escochea that there was a man with a knife in the store. During the time that she was talking to Escochea, Ms. Lopez was robbed and stabbed. The struggle and assault is overheard by phone and has been recorded in the dispatcher's office. A patrol unit was sent into the area and arrived there about a minute or two later, however the victim had already been wounded.

Mr. George Aguirre who had left the Sigmor to go for help had by this time traveled

westbound on the frontage road, gone around the freeway and was now traveling east bound on State Highway 358, he stated that as he passed the Sigmor Service Station he observed a struggle going on inside the store and that the subject who had approached him for a ride was assaulting the clerk. He then continued traveling, got off at the Kostoryz Exit and went to the Gulf Bowl and asked the Private Security Guard to go help the clerk, but the Guard refused and only offered to call the police. Mr. Aguirre then got back into his van and drove back to the Sigmor Service Station to see if he could be of any assistance to the clerk. By the time he reached the location he found that the police had already arrived on the scene.

Mr. Kevan Baker, a customer, also went to the Sigmor Service station and he had just pulled up to the gas pump and was going to put gas in his car when his attention was drawn by a loud thump on the glass window. He observed the suspect and the victim struggling, he saw that the suspect was trying to shove the victim into the utility room of the service station. When he realized that the woman was being assaulted he began to walk toward the service station, the suspect saw him and they met as the suspect was coming out of the service station, Mr. Baker was threatened with his life by the suspect if he attempted to stop him. The suspect then fled on foot. Mr. Baker then saw the victim, Wanda Lopez also coming out of the store, she was asking for help, he saw that she was bleeding profusely.

Mr. John Arsuaga and his wife Julie were driving up onto the parking lot of Phase III, which is also located in the 2600 block of SPID and which is about two buildings to the left of the Sigmor Station. They both observed a Hispanic Male subject running away from the area and by his actions, they felt that something was wrong, all within a matter of seconds, they realized that something had indeed occurred at the Sigmor Station, as they saw the Police units arriving in the area. Mr. Arsuaga then went and reported to one of the police units of the man they had seen fleeing from the area.

All of the above mentioned witnesses were able to identify the suspect involved in this offense as being Carlos DeLunda. Mrs. Arsusga was not able to identify the suspect, other than to give a clothing description and approximate physical description, due to the fact that she does wear prescription glasses and she was not wearing them at the time that she and her husband encountered the suspect.

Aid Ambulance arrived on the scene and provided the victim with first aid prior to her being transported to MMC. Victim passed away sometime around 9:50 P.M. Cause of her death was two stab wounds to the left side of her body.

Shortly after the robbery and aggravated assault numerous patrol units were in the area searching the area for the suspect. The dispatcher's office kept receiving different reports of different locations where the suspect, DeLuna was observed. Several patrol units were on foot pursuit of suspect. DeLuna was finally captured in the 4900 block of Franklin where he was hiding beneath a pick up truck. This was near the intersection of Franklin and Nemece. Mrs. Theresa Barrera advised that it was her truck that the suspect was hiding under.

Suspect was returned to the scene of the robbery and aggravated assault and the witnesses did view him separately. He was identified as being the same one that they had seen earlier. It was further observed that at the time of arrest, the suspect was no longer wearing a shirt and neither was he wearing shoes.

On 02-05-83 Sgt. Shedd was called to the home of Armando Garcia, at 4946 Easter, where he showed Sgt. Shedd a long sleeve white shirt and a pair of white tennis shoes which he had found in his yard. This home is near the area where the suspect DeLuna was arrested.

The crime scene was processed and a lockblade knife was found in the store, underneath the cash register tray, on the floor. The knife was observed to have some type of substance which appeared to be some type of body tissue or body fat.
