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On 02-04-83 reporting officer reported to the scene of an aggravated robbery at the Sigmor Service Station at 2602 SPID, time of arrival was approximately 8:15 p.m. at time of arrival I observed that AID ambulance attendants were administering first aid to a Hispanic female, who I observed to be barefooted, wearing dark brown slacks, a light brown blouse and a white smock. The soles of her feet were observed to be bloodied. I later learned from one of the AID supervisors on the scene that the woman had a single stab wound to the left side of her body. AID attendants worked on the woman at the scene for a long time before she was transferred to MMC for further treatment. At the time she left the scene I learned that she was in critical condition.

I learned later, sometime around 10:00 p.m. that the woman had died at MMC sometime around 9:50 p.m.

I also observed that the area immediately outside the door of the service station and to the left had several areas which had blood smeared on the glass, on the door and also on the ground. There was an area approximately 32 inches to the left of the door which had a large pool of thick blood and substance on the ground. From here I observed that there was blood smeared about 23 inches up ^{from the ground} on the metal molding, to the right of this area ^{from the ground} ~~was~~ more blood smears, which was approximately 24 inches on the metal molding, to the right of this area, still approaching the door, was another area which had blood smears on the glass, this was measured at approximately 43 inches from the ground level. The sidewalk measures approximately 34 inches in width, and there was blood smeared in different areas of the side walk in and around on the ground immediately outside of the door.

Sgt. Infante of the ID section was on the scene which had been secured and sealed by Patrol, and after the victim had been removed, Sgt. Infante did then process the door for prints. Also numerous photographs of the crime scene, outside, were taken, prior to he and I going into the store. Upon entering the service station, I observed that a radio was playing loudly. I also observed that there was blood smeared on the door handle on the inside of the door, and on the lower left hand side of the door there was blood smeared on the door frame. I saw that there was a trail of blood, and foot prints in blood, leading from behind the counter, heading toward the door, this trail of blood

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was approximately 134½" from the door edge to the lower right hand corner of the counter, it varied in width from 14" to 19" in different locations along the way. The trail led back behind the check out counter where the whole area was in total disarray and more blood was found in the area. I observed that a roll-about stool, black and gray in color, the chair had roller casters on it, was pulled out in front of the check out counter, it was closer to the coolers, between the coolers and a baseball cap display. The victim's multicolored sweater, was still hanging on the stool. I later learned that the chair is always supposed to be behind the counter.

The check out counter is approximately 18" wide and approximately 71" in length, there is a flip top counter, and this is approximately 25" in width. I observed that there were several merchandise displays on this counter, I also saw a writing pen, a penny and a calculator on the counter. I also saw a package of "Winston" brand cigarettes, they were next to the calculator. This package was processed for latent fingerprints by Sgt. Infante. The package was later tagged for evidence, #40151.

As I walked back behind the counter, I saw that the trail of blood came from this area, signs of a struggle was obvious, there were paper towels scattered, they were bloodied, a calendar laid on the floor, the upper left hand corner of it was bloodied, I saw a cigarette butt nearby, a plastic bag, the type used by the store to place cold drinks in, was also close by and it had blood pools on top of it, there was blood smeared all over the tile floor in this area, it was splattered on the lower portion of the door leading to the storage room, a soft drink display was also back here, and several of the drinks had been knocked to the ground, one of the victim's slaps was laying right side up, the front of the shoe was pointing toward the west corner of the store (away from the counter). The other slap was observed to be laying upside down, the sole of the shoe was bloodied, and it laid near the doorway leading into the storage room. I saw that there was a maroon colored button laying on the red floor mat, An empty penny wrapper, and a penny were on the floor underneath the cash register tray. This was in the area immediately to the right of the cash register tray, and the area which contains the store safe. A stainless steel lockblade knife was also found on the floor, near the left hand side of the safe, near where the penny and penny wrapper were found. This knife was also processed for prints by Sgt. Infante, however with negative results. It was tagged with evidence tag # 40153.

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It should also be noted that the knife did have some type of substance on it, it appeared to be some type of body tissue substance, it resembled some type of fatty type substance, it was clear in color and appeared to have congeled in areas. A five dollar bill was also found to be laying on the floor underneath the cash register tray, it was observed to have a blood stain on it. It was tagged with evidence tag # 40150. The cash register tray, which as mentioned before was pulled out, two five dollar bills laid across the area where the coins are deposited and kept separate from each other. I observed that the coins were still in their respective slots in the tray. A carbon ~~copy~~ ^{paper} torn from the credit card receipt from a previous customer was also haphazardly laying on top of the tray. I observed that the front of the cash register machine itself was covered with blood on the front portion of it. The back side of the check out counter was observed to have blood smears on the lower right hand corner. I also saw that there was some blood smeared on the counter top. The telephone was cradled properly and was heard to be ringing a few minutes after we entered the premises. It was also processed for prints, as Dispatcher Escochea had stated that he had been talking to the victim and that he had heard the struggle and then the phone had been dropped. No prints were found on the phone. I noticed that the victim's purse and a comb were underneath the counter, the check out counter faces in an eastwardly direction. The keys to the safe were still in the key slot and did not appear to have been disturbed. I also saw that there was a "Kool Tube" laying on the floor near the bloodied shoe near the entrance to the storage room. All of the items found as evidence were tagged by reporting officer.

While still at the scene I learned from Lt. McConley that a suspect had been apprehended and he was brought back to the scene where he was viewed separately by several witnesses who were able to ID the subject. After positive ID was made, suspect who was identified as Carlos DeLuna, 3/15/62, living at 2046 Rockford was then transported to City Jail. See Supplementary reports for details of apprehension and ID of subject.

Witnesses were transported to the station and statements were taken from them which related to us what they had individually observed about the robbery/homicide.

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The following items were located at the scene of an aggravated robbery and homicide which occurred on 02-04-83 at the Sigmor Shamrock Service Station at 2602 SPID. The items were picked up and tagged by this officer.

- One brown slap(shoe) brown leather type strap with burlap material trim on the side of the soles, shoe was found on the floor behind the counter; shoe was approximately one foot away from a soft drink display which was also located behind the counter. Item picked up, and retrieved for evidence at approximately 9:40 p.m. Evidence tag # 40147.
- A maroon colored button--possibly a men's button--found on the red floor mat behind the counter. Retrieved at 9:32 p.m. Evidence tag #40148.
- A cigarette butt, no distinguishing brand on it, found on the floor also behind the counter--laying close to a calendar near a pool of blood--a white plastic bag with pools of blood on it was also near this item. Retrieved at 9:55 p.m. Evidence tag # 40149.
- U.S. Currency, a five dollar bill, serial number B12101408 B has blood substance on it, found on the floor underneath the cash register tray. Retrieved at 9:35 p.m. Evidence tag # 40150.
- A package of Winston Brand cigarettes, found laying on the counter next to the calculator at the check out counter. Retrieved at 9:30 p.m. Evidence tag # 40151.
- A woman's watch, "Advance Quartz" gold digital watch, removed from the victim by AID ambulance attendants. Evidence tag # 40152.
- A stainless steel lockblade knife, frown wood handle with gold colored tips on either side of the wood handle, "Pakistan" brand has some type of matter--possible body tissue substance on it. Found underneath the opened cash tray, knife was on the floor next to the side of the store safe. Retrieved at 9:25 P.M. Evidence tag # 40153.

A calendar, has large blood spot splattered on the upper left hand corner of it, found behind the counter on the floor near a pool of blood, a cigarette butt is near the lower left hand corner of the calendar, a white plastic bag which had blood pools on it was also near by. Retrieved at 9:52 p.m. Evidence tag # 40154.

9. A brown slap(shoe) brown leather type strap with burlap material trim on the side of the soles, this is the companion shoe to Evidence tag # 40147, shoe was found laying close to the opened door leading to the storage room, shoe was observed to be laying upside down, and the sole of the shoe is bloodied. Retrieved at 9:50 p.m. Evidence tag # 40155.

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Statements obtained from the following individuals revealed the following information:

1. George Aguirre, 1745 Morales, telephone number: 853-1376, advised in his statement that he was at the Sigmor Station gasing up his van when he was approached by the suspect and asked if he would furnish him with a ride to the Club Casino. That Mr. Aguirre, that he then saw the suspect put a knife, possibly a locking blade type knife in his pocket, that he further saw the suspect holding a beer in his hand, also saw the subject walk back toward the ice machine. That Mr. Aguirre then went into the service station to pay for his gas and that at that time he advised the female attendant about the man with the knife being outside the store, that he told her he was going to call the police, and she also said she would be placing a call to the police. That as he was leaving the area he did see the man armed with the knife walk into the store . Mr. Aguirre then drove west of the frontage road, went under the freeway and then drove eastbound on the freeway, that as he passed the Sigmor station he saw the clerk and the same armed man struggling inside the store. That he then drove to Gulf Bowl and there asked a private security officer to help, but subject refused, saying all he could do was call for a police unit. Mr. Aguirre then returned to the Sigmor and at that time the Police units had already arrived. He then learned that the woman had been stabbed. He was later able to identify the man who was apprehended a short time later as being the same person who he had seen with the knife and who had also asked him for a ride.

2. Mr. Kevan Baker, 3030 Peachtree, #1, #8551600 , advised that at approximately 8:15 P.M. he pulled into the Sigmor Service station at 2602 SPID and that he was first alerted to the situation when he heard a bang inside the store, that he then saw a Hispanic man and a woman in a struggle, that the Hispanic male was pulling the woman by her hair and was trying to shove her into the back room of the service station. That he then began to walk toward the service station in an attempt to help the woman, that as he approached the station, the Hispanic man came out and that they met face to face, the suspect told him not to mess with him as he had a gun. That the subject then fled off behind the station. That another man then drove up and Mr. Baker asked him to call the police, that the attendant was by then coming out of the store and asking for help, that he observed her to be bleeding and had blood all over her. That later this same

~~evening he was asked to view a possible suspect in a patrol unit, that he did see the man and that he did identify him as being the same one that he had seen struggling with the woman, and also being the same one who confronted him~~

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- John Arsuaga, 1432 Devon, #3 telephone number 852-2391, advised that he and his wife, Jule were pulling into the parking lot at Phase III also in the 2600 block of SPID and that they both observed a Hispanic male subject running across a vacant lot adjacent to Phase III, that he thought the man's behavior was peculiar, as he momentarily stopped, and then kept on running, that at this same time his attention was drawn toward the Sigmor Station and he observed the police units arriving at the scene, that he then went to the police and told them about the man he had seen running from the area, and that he gave them the direction of travel and a description of the man, that later this same date while he was giving a statement to Sgt. Escobedo, he had been asked to view a photograph line-up and that after viewing the photographs he was able to identify the man he had seeing running in the area.
- Jesus Escochea, 6433 S. Staples, #80 employed by the Corpus Christi Police Dept. as a dispatcher, that he was on duty on 2/4/83 and did answer a call from a female who told him that she was at the Sigmor Station at 2602 SPID and that she told Escochea that there was a man in the store who was armed with a knife, that he proceeded to try and get a description of the offender, however was unable to get a concise description due to the fact that the attendant said the offender was nearby. That while he was still talking to her he heard her scream, a commotion was then heard, followed by more screams and yells from the woman. That he then did advise another dispatcher, Cheryl Roberts to send a unit on a 17 (emergency run) to the Sigmor Station for an armed robbery in progress.

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
