PSYCHOLOGICAL TEST REPORT

SOURCE AND REASON FOR REFERRAL:

Carlos is being referred by the Intake Caseworker,
Mr. Al Reyna, for intellectual and personality evaluation.

TEST RESULTS:

Carlos is of average size for his chronological age. He readily interacted with the examiner, exhibiting no overt signs of anxiety. Almost from the time he first began to be tested, Carlos appeared to be attempting to "con" the examiner. For example, he said that he had some eye problems that caused him headaches and eye pain, and needed medical attention. He also stated that were he to be released with his mother or father that he would live with them and promised to stay out of trouble. In general his behavior appeared to be quite manipulative.

Results of the WISC-R indicate that Carlos is presently functioning within the dull-normal range on the verbal portion and within the average range on the non-verbal or performance portion of the test (Verbal I.Q. 80, Performance 96, Full Scale 87). The difference between the verbal and performance scores is significant. It reflects the bilingual background that Carlos has as well as Carlos' tendency to have minimally involved himself in scholastic areas. For example, his lowest scores were

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on tasks measuring long-term memory, information that is gained through reading and involvement in school related areas, and on verbal analogies, a task that measures both vocabulary and verbal fluency. He functioned within the bright-normal range on tasks measuring nonverbal reasoning and on a sequencing task which also measures social awareness and social reasoning.

The drawing tasks were made hurriedly and with minimal attention to detail. They reflect limited ego-involvement, but give no evidence of visual-perceptual problems or organic involvement.

Results of personality testing reflect a boy who exhibits massive denial as far as any serious problems are concerned. Most of his energies were geared to manipulate his way out of the unpleasant surroundings (detention). However, his manipulations tend to be very transparent. Additionally, he tends to deny having a temper and in general attempted to "fake good" on personality tests. He obviously resents being locked up and very openly spoke of the need to get out of detention including saying that it made him afraid, that it made him wish he were away from it all and that it affected his sleep, etc. He generally appeared to be rather immature and impulsive in his behavior. Results of the High School Personality Questionnaire reflect a non-anxious boy who is outwardly calm and controlled. He exhibits dull thinking, is undemonstrative and generally appears easy going and sees himself as somewhat sensitive and serious.

In summary, results of testing reflect an immature somewhat impulsive though non-anxious boy. His major concern at a conscious level was to deny any serious problems, to verbalize considerable upset at being locked up, and in general massively denying any personal problems. He attempts to manipulate people in a fairly transparent fashion. If his manipulations weren't so obvious, he could be a pleasant boy to be around. There is no evidence of a severe emotional disturbance or disturbed and/or psychotic-thinking problems present at this time.

It is my impression that Carlos has not learned to develop adequate controls over his impulses. He could benefit from a more structured environment, and one in which rules of behavior are reinforced. His present living situation in which he is free to roam and do as he pleases is totally inadequate. Unless a more structured environment is provided, it is anticipated that more delinquent behavior will be exhibited.
