

Local men are jailed

Three held in two homicides

Three local men were in jail yesterday on charges of murder in connection with two homicides last weekend.

Two men were arrested on charges of capital murder in connection with the Robstown beating and cutting death last weekend of Efraim Hernandez, 21, of Corpus Christi.

Arrested after turning themselves in at the Corpus Christi police department were Alonzo Gonzales, 24, of 442 Van Cleave Dr., and Julian Velasquez, 23, of 116 Shely. They were being held in jail last night under \$50,000 bonds.

Hernandez's body was found in a Robstown city park Saturday morning. He had been beaten and cut with a bottle. Robstown police handled the in-

vestigation of the murder.

Charged with murder yesterday in connection with the weekend stabbing death of local interior designer Carl Thomas Madeley, 42, was Eugene Brad-dock Taylor, 24. No permanent address was available for Taylor, who is being held under a \$20,000 bond.

Madeley's nude body was found in the living room of his home at 327 Palmero Monday. He had been stabbed 33 times in the chest and neck. The county medical examiner has said the nature and severity of the attack indicate the death is a homosexual murder.

Police said Taylor had stayed with Madeley for about two weeks, but had

moved out about two weeks ago. He was arrested Tuesday as a material witness in connection with the murder and was charged late yesterday afternoon.

City police still have not made any arrests in connection with the stabbing death of Raul Gamez, 22, last Saturday night. He was attacked by a group of 10 persons as he and his brother were walking in the 600 block of Harmon. He suffered two stab wounds in the back.

And Portland police still are investigating the death of Shirley Jackson Limuel, whose body was found floating in the bay near Portland May 17. An investigator said yesterday he does not expect any arrests before the middle of next week.
